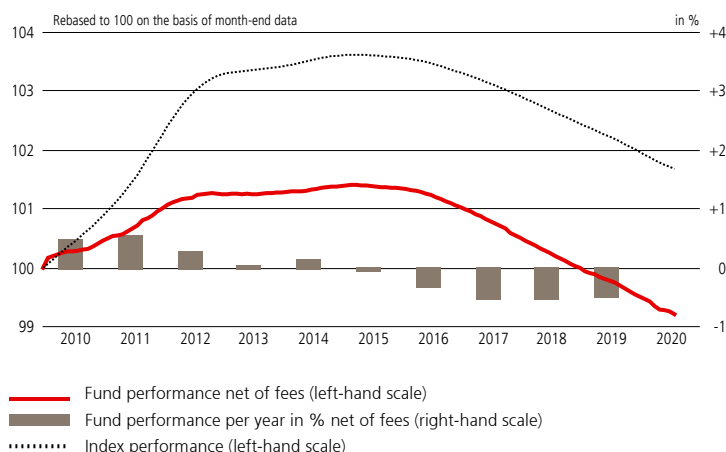
Fund description
