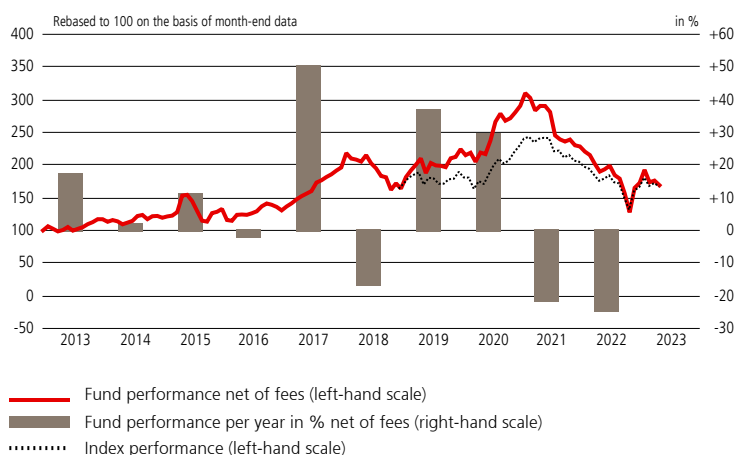
Performance Review

The Chinese equity market continued to consolidate in April. The market was still doubtful over the sustainability of economic growth in China, with some investors taking profits or waiting on the sidelines for further evidence.

Monthly performance

In April the fund performed negatively with 4.0%. Performance was negative in April as the market consolidated on profit-taking pressure.

YTD performance

YTD as of the end of April, the fund has delivered a negative performance of 2.0%. For its part, the overall market generated slightly better returns. China's GDP grew 4.5% year-on-year in the first quarter of 2023, beating market expectations at this early stage of reopening.

Performance contributors

Holdings in communication services added the most value. NetEase was a key contributor as the company received approval for several major game titles in the past few months. In addition, there was a strong performance by existing games such as Eggy Party.

Performance detractors

In contrast, positions in industrials weighed on performance. In particular, Hainan Meilan Airport detracted due to a delay in renewing the contract for the terminal with China Duty Free.

Chinese equities retreated after the initial rally driven by the rapid economic reopening. Moving forward, the focus is on the sustainability of China's economic recovery. Investors are focusing on high-frequency indicators such as the purchasing managers' index (PMI) and property sales as well as company fundamentals such as corporate earnings growth and guidance.
