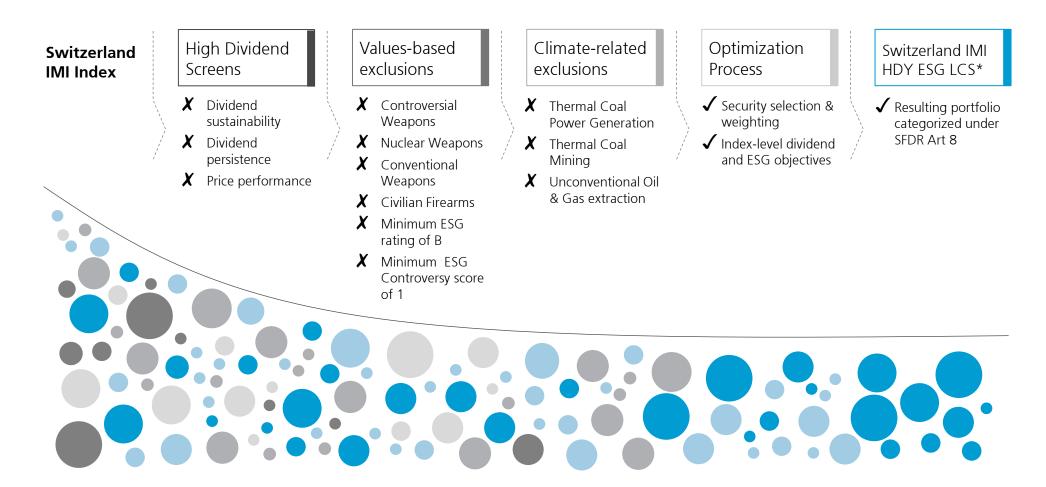

High dividend screens

Selecting persistent and high-quality dividends

Sustainability screening: The dividend payout ratio may indicate whether future dividend payments might be in jeopardy. Exclude securities with:

- Zero or negative payout ratios -> do not pay dividends or have negative earnings which may put their future dividend payments at risk.
- Extremely high payout ratios* -> occurs when earnings are low relative to dividends

Persistence screening: Negative Dividend-per-share (DPS) growth is an indicator of shrinking dividend growth which could be a precursor to lower dividends.

Exclude securities with a negative 5Y DPS growth

Price performance screening: Securities ranked in the bottom 5% of the universe of securities with negative 1-year price performance are excluded from the index.

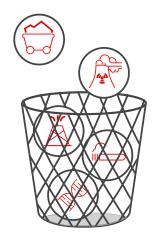

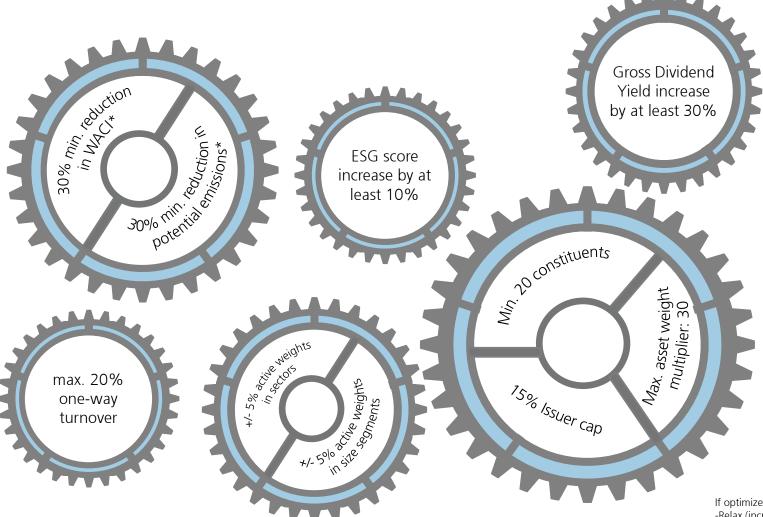

-Relax (reduce) yield improvement constraint in steps of 3% from 30% till 15%

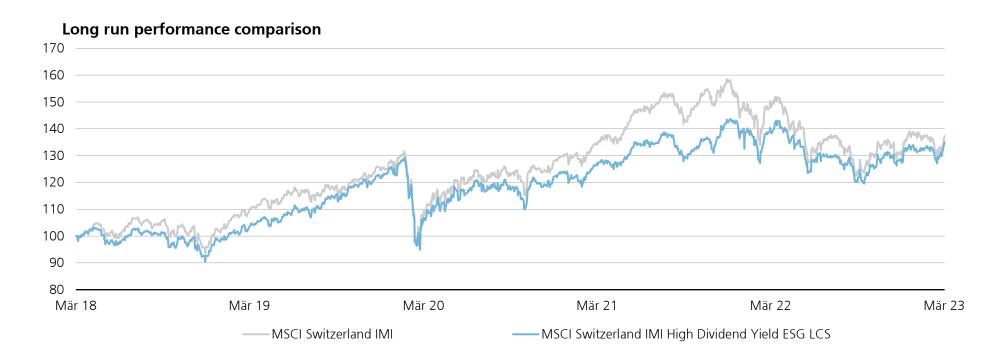

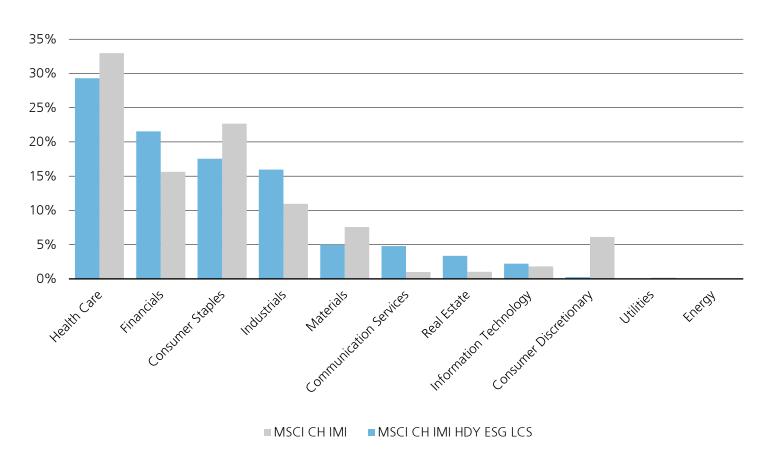

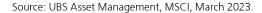
