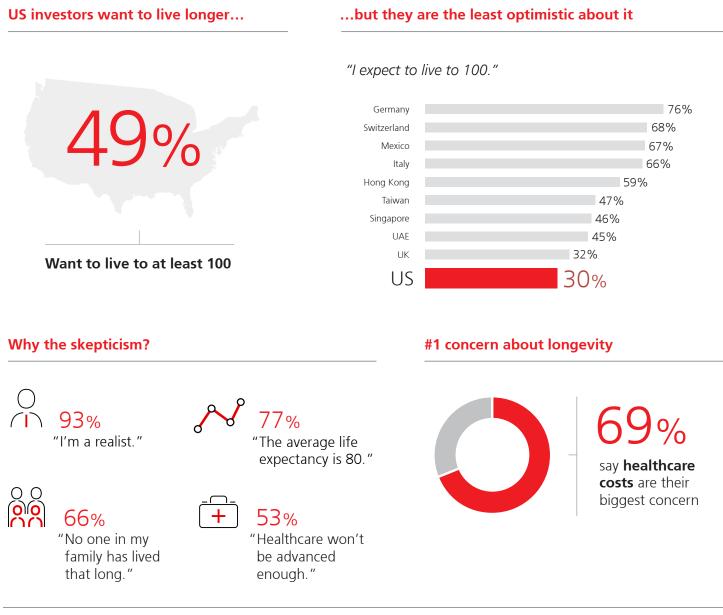

57% worry their health will deteriorate in the **next 10 years**



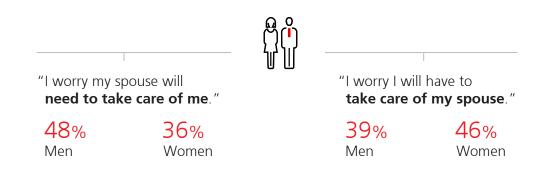
